CFA Develops First Camp CATOCTIN

(Children ATtaining Objective Critical Thinking Inspired by Nature)

It has been 20 years since the echoes of student voices filled the cabins at Camp Greentop as part of the Frederick County Outdoor School Program. Since then, a full generation of youth has missed the opportunity to grow socially, emotionally and academically in the residential setting of Catoctin Mountain Park. The Catoctin Forest Alliance is taking first steps towards restoration of learning activities for today's youth through Camp CATOCTIN, to be held daily from June 27 through July 1.

The summer day camp program is sponsored by the National Park Foundation through an Every Kid in the Park grant awarded to Catoctin Mountain Park and the Catoctin Forest Alliance. The primary goal of this grant is to introduce 4th grade students to recreational and educational benefits offered by the National Park System, to encourage them to seek outdoor activity and to start them on the road to environmental stewardship.

This year's Camp CATOCTIN is a pilot program that will be evaluated for replication on a larger scale in future years. Invitations to join the program will be given to the 4th grade class from Westminster Elementary School in Carroll County, MD. Classroom teachers will select the 40 participants most likely to experience success and growth from the experience.

Catoctin Mountain Park will serve as the primary venue with Cunningham Falls State Park providing facilities for the recreational day on Friday and interpreters for the Scales and Tails on Wednesday. Daily activities include interaction and interpretive programs with National or State Park Rangers, hiking, service projects, and crafts.

Ms. Brenda Newhouse, Frederick County Outdoor School Teacher, and Ms. Amanda Frushour, Carroll County STEM Teacher, are the primary instructors. Local businesses and service organizations are being invited to join in venture through sponsorship or donation of food or craft materials. Adult and high school age volunteers are needed to fill various capacities including camp photographer, lunch runner, Friday lunch grillers and general participation and camper guidance. Fourth Annual Day of Service in Catoctin Mountain Park By Jim Sundergill





The Catoctin Forest Alliance will have their Fourth Annual "Day of Service" at Camp Greentop in Catoctin Mountain Park on **May 14.** The event will be held from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. with check-in at Camp Greentop's auditorium from 8:00-9:00 a.m. This is a great opportunity for CFA friends and members to come to the park, enjoy the beautiful outdoor setting, do a service project in the park, and enjoy a lunch provided by CFA. Each participant will receive a CFA patch.

This year we will be staining cabins and eradicating invasive plant species. There is no lower age limit for participants but all will be expected to work for four to five hours that day. The work is usually such that younger children would not be able to contribute but parents can decide on an individual basis if their child will

Snap It! Don't Stomp It! - The Catoctin BioBlitz By Ed Wenschhof



In celebration of the NPS Centennial, the NPS is coordinating a service-wide BioBlitz initiative to help inspire the next generation of stewards and provide a national snapshot of biodiversity. The National Capital Region (NPS-NCR) of the NPS will host a showcase BioBlitz and Festival at the National Mall on May 20-21, 2016. Other parks in the NPS-NCR are also hosting BioBlitz (es) of various sizes. Catoctin Mountain Park will host a BioBlitz focusing on insects at the Misty Mount Cabin Area. The Catoctin MP event is titled "Snap It! Don't Stomp It! - The Catoctin Insect BioBlitz." Snap referring to a camera or camera phone. During this citizen science event, insects of all kinds will be photographed and submitted electronically

to a central hub along with many other parks. Various taxa are being targeted in different parks; however, insects were chosen at Catoctin MP as we have the least information on that taxa category.

Friday May 20 is being planned as a school event, while Saturday May 21 is being planned as a public event (including individuals, Scouts, and community or conservation groups). The park looks forward to working with the public, youth, schools, Scouts, and scientists to seek and document the diversity of insect life within Catoctin MP. The Misty Mount dining hall will serve as the hub for the event and feature displays and information about all of the natural history of Catoctin MP. Spring in the Village Art at the Furnace in Historic Catoctin Furnace

Celebrate Mother's Day weekend in the historic village of Catoctin Furnace and experience art, live music, food and more. All events run Saturday, May 7, 2016 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 8, 2016 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Admission to the festival is free. Parking and shuttle service is available at the Cunningham Falls State Park Manor Area.

New this year is a juried art show of vendors from across Maryland on the furnace grounds, blacksmithing demonstrations under the historic "Isabella" furnace-casting shed. Children's activities provided by Frederick County Public Libraries and Rose Hill Manor Children's Museum will be on site along with live birds of prey from the Maryland Park Service's Scales and Tales program.

Featured events include the annual Sarah's Garden Social presented by Harriet Chapel which features garden plants, herbs and mother's day decorative plants, a beekeeping display and honey products, a gardener's yard sale, traditional music, craft vendors, hot sandwiches, soups, fresh fruit cups and delicious baked goods. The Catoctin Furnace Historical Society will have their historic workers cottages open for public tour, craft vendors and a wine event with local winery Springfield Manor. Catoctin Furnace is a Frederick County Landmark and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, located south of Thurmont, MD off of Route 15 on Route 806. Some of the proceeds from the juried art event will be used for the restoration and maintenance of the historic structures including the furnace stack, casting shed, retaining wall and Ironmaster's Mansion. This event is a result of collaboration between multiple community organizations including Harriet Chapel, Catoctin Forest Alliance, Catoctin Furnace Historical Society, the Friends of Cunningham Falls and Gambrill State Parks, Inc. and the Maryland Park Service.




AIR Exhibit at Emmitsburg Library


