Art Show



- Pastel Print by Linda Sundergill Janet Springer


Many thanks to Elizabeth Prongas, chairman of the event, who provided the studio and know how to make this event a success.

There were 6 youth and 26 adults participating in this year's event. A large contingent of Rotarians helped out as did several groups of Girl Scouts and many volunteers who didn't indicate affiliation with any group. As we did last year, CFA provided lunch for all participants. Debbie Mills and her grandkids Shane and Samantha set up a cold cut buffet at mid-day and everyone made their own sandwiches the way they wanted to. As usual, there was a lot left over for the Rangers to enjoy.

The projects this year were bayberry eradication and staining of cabins 76 and 77 at Camp Greentop. It looks as though we may have found our niche as cabin strainers and eradicators of invasive species. This activity was organized as part of CFA's support of Catoctin Mountain Park and it was disappointing in that only four CFA members showed up to support the event. Hopefully with plenty of advance notice and an earlier posting of projects to be worked, attendance will improve next year.




